

#### Mark Glendon Raquepo ——

Mr. Raquepo grew up in a family with 5 siblings and his mom and dad. Life, especially even before the vast growth of technology, was never easy. His dad was a farmer and a part-time bus driver. Mr. Raquepo, who is the eldest son of the family, does everything he can do to help his parents. When he was just in elementary, he used to come with his dad to town to sell vegetables and fish.



He still does the same thing in high school – doing a parttime job as a bus conductor for his dad. He never stopped helping his family, even in college wherein he came to work from 6 in the evening to 6 in the morning as a security guard until he finished his studies. After graduating from college, with his perseverance, he passed the entrance exam in 2 agencies he applied to and chose Crystal wherein he started his journey as a cadet.

There are a lot of things he learned from being a Crystal cadet and "DISCIPLINE" is number one on his list. He still remembers his training days vividly, where every Saturday they took examinations, every duty they would stand still and firm at their post the whole day, they strictly did proper checking of uniforms, which also included shoes and haircut. They also strictly follow the English only policy when communicating with everyone and they elect officers that create and mold potential leaders. To some it may seem like their hard days, but to Mr. Raquepo is one of the things he is grateful for.

His experiences in his early life helped him to treasure time and grab every opportunity given to him to study more, learn more so he could be able to be in a place where he could lift other people as well. He is also grateful for the cadetship program – for helping him be prepared physically, intellectually, and emotionally. He is also grateful to all the crew he worked with, especially to those who were with him on his first vessel.

For our cadets who are on the road towards achieving their dreams, Captain Raquepo said, don't just keep on dreaming but set goals and plans to achieve them. Do your part as a Crystal Cadet. Don't waste the opportunities given by Crystal. For those who are already onboard, give your best. Follow the rules and regulations inside the ship. Follow the instructions given by your officers and other crew – they will be your first teachers onboard and your family at the same time. Don't be discouraged or be afraid, because people who have gone through a cadetship program like Captain Raquepo already know how you feel, and they will be there to help and guide you.

It was a privilege to get to know Captain Raquepo through our short interview via call. A jolly yet humble person with high hopes and dreams for the future. 
Nikko, is a fun-loving, strict goal getter. Growing-up in a farm land, Nikko learned to strategize things from selling different items in grade school to farming, from making impossible possible to competing in different school events in order to support his parents financially.

He learned so many life lessons from his parents that led him to decide to enter the seafaring career in 2006. Back then, he was inclined to arts and wanted to take an art-related course but because of hardships financially and emotionally, Nikko set aside his wants and focused on the need as he did not want to stop his schooling and did not want to add burden to the family. He passed and went on a full-scholar maritime school where he graduated with flying colors.

Three months after his graduation, his father died and all family decisions were shared to him by his mom. He started sailing and at 26 he became a Chief Officer onboard a multi-national crew vessel — the break that he has been waiting for. During his shore vacation, he would attend school, take care of their businesses, teach, assess and supervise in maritime training centers and schools and manage some local maritime offices.

At 31, he owns some businesses in and out of the maritime industry - The SEAker Systems Inc., Saint Nicholas Coffee and Tea Co., JJ Anchors Co., Supernova Philippines Inc. and Regadera Plant Trading Co. – all of which are products of perseverance, hard work and determination.

Nikko joined the management of Crystal Shipping Inc. last September 2021.




#### **SUPERNOVA**

On the first day of the webinar series, Ms. Sheila Caracta tackled "Introduction to Financial Literacy." The discussion was about investing money, how and where, and things to consider before deciding. Ms. Shiela made the seminar interactive by encouraging the participants to use the chatbox. She introduces the different choices for where to put your money. She advises the attendees about investment. The management had some icebreakers connected to the topic. Those who won received a 50php gcash load. We had over 75 people participate.

In the second week of the series, we reached over 100 attendees. Ms. Emily Crisostomo is the speaker on the 2nd topic: Real Estate. She highlighted the critical terms in financial education: income, expense, asset, liability, and cash flow. She also discussed what an investment is. She explains the difference between an asset and an investment.

Mr. Christian Caracta, the Education and Training Committee Head, presented to Ms. Emily Crisostomo the Certificate of Appreciation for sharing her valuable knowledge as the guest speaker.

For the third webinar series, Mr. Malvin Leano was the guest speaker. He talked about the fundamentals of the stock market and encouraged ka-SeaSeed to invest there. "Don't buy those things because we want them; buy them because we need them," he mentioned. He discussed what they needed to know about growing money to meet their objectives and beat inflation. He also gives a glimpse of the "Rule of 72," which is how to double your money when investing. After the discussion proper, closing remarks follow.

Our very own Chairperson, Mr. Mark Rence Miguel guested for the fourth and second to the last webinar series, "cryptocurrency." He started with the history of cryptocurrency for easy understanding of the participants. He tacked blockchain as he explained a cryptocurrency wallet and its two types: software and hardware. Software wallets include applications for desktops and mobile devices, for example, Coins.ph, Abra, etc. The second type of crypto wallet is hardware. Hardware wallets are the most popular type of wallet because you can store your private keys and remove them from your device. Examples of hardware wallets are SafePal, Trezor, and Ledger. He shared how he earns from cryptocurrency.



Following the speaker's presentation, Mr. Christian Caracta presented the certificate of appreciation to Mr. Mark Rence Miguel for sharing his knowledge.

"Starting your own business" was the last and final Investment 101 Five Seeds Webinar series by Mr. James Niko Hosana. He started discussing the founders' encounters on their entrepreneurial journey. The discussion focused on the e 12 steps in considering opening a business. Some of these are identifying your goal in establishing a business, your hobbies, potential market, etc., which was very informative and helpful.

Pursuant to Presidential Decree (PD) 474, Republic Act 10635, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), Republic Act 11032 otherwise known as the "Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018" and the International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, 1978, the schedule of Fees and Charges prescribed under Memorandum Circular No. SC-2021-07 pertaining to the issuance, revalidation and replacement of COCs and COPs are hereby amended as follows:

## MARITIME 2022 UPDATES 2022

Fees concerning the same Types of Application as covered by the respective Fees and Other Charges Articles of MARINA Memorandum Circular Nos. 2021-03, 2021-04, 2021-05, and 2021-06 are likewise amended, based on the above table.

This Memorandum Circular shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.

#### MARINA releases MISMO-related updates

MANILA - The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) released MIS-MO-related updates and guidelines for seafarers, licensed manning agencies (LMAs), and MARINA-Compliant Medical Facilities of Overseas Workers and Seafarers (MFOWS) together with their accredited Medical Practitioners, through MARINA Advisory 2022-35.

These published updates and guidelines are in line with the full implementation of MARINA Circular SC-2022-02 on the revised fees of two STCW Certificates and MARINA Advisory 2022-04 or the "Amendment to MARINA Advisory 2021-65" on New COC and COP Formats which are pursuant to RA 10635 and its revised Implementing Rules and Regulations, the relevant provisions of the 1978 STCW Convention and Code, and RA 11032 or the "Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018". ]

The MARINA enjoins all concerned to be guided with these new updates as they are relevant to a seafarer's STCW Certificates application processes, related fees, transfer of payments, sea service and medical certification requirements and the accredited LMAs' and medical facilities' role in the issuance of their certificates.

## MARITIME 2022 UPDATES 2022

MANILA -- The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) has released MARINA Advisory No. 2022-41 on 04 August 2022, urging all seafarers onboard ocean-going merchant ships, whose certificates are already expired from 01 July 2022, to request for revalidation via expedite application through their Licensed Manning Agencies (LMAs).

Further, seafarers shall likewise submit the following to their respective LMAs in addition to the documentary requirements relative to the certificate being applied: (1) Copy of crew list; (2) Copy of Contract of Employment; (3) 1st page of SIRB/SRB and the relevant page with embarkation entry, and; (4) Attestation signed by the Master that the applicant is currently onboard.

All other Filipino seafarers with expiring STCW certificates were advised to apply for revalidation through their MISMO accounts, at least three (3) months prior to its expiration.

The revalidation of such certificates is in accordance with the existing MARINA policies, rules and regulations, and relevant provisions of the STCW Convention, 1978, as amended.

On 23 December 2021, the MARINA has issued an advisory granting a one (1) year validity extension for certificates expiring between the period 01 January 2022 to 30 June 2022.
